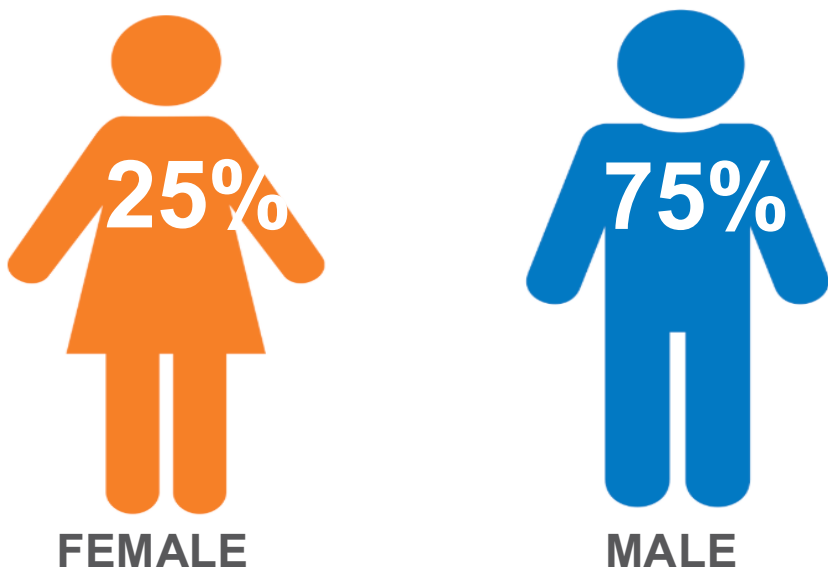

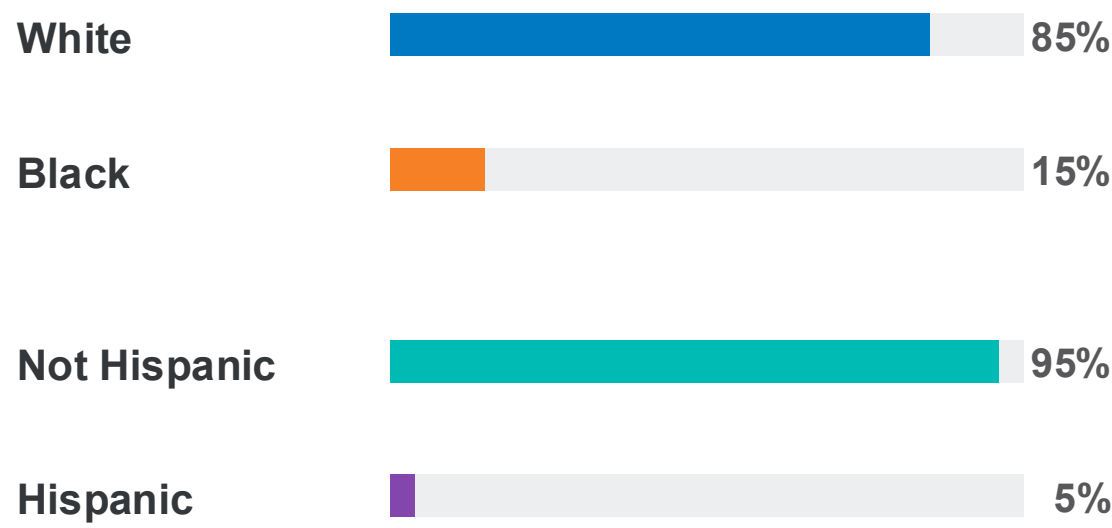
AGE DISTRIBUTION



GENDER

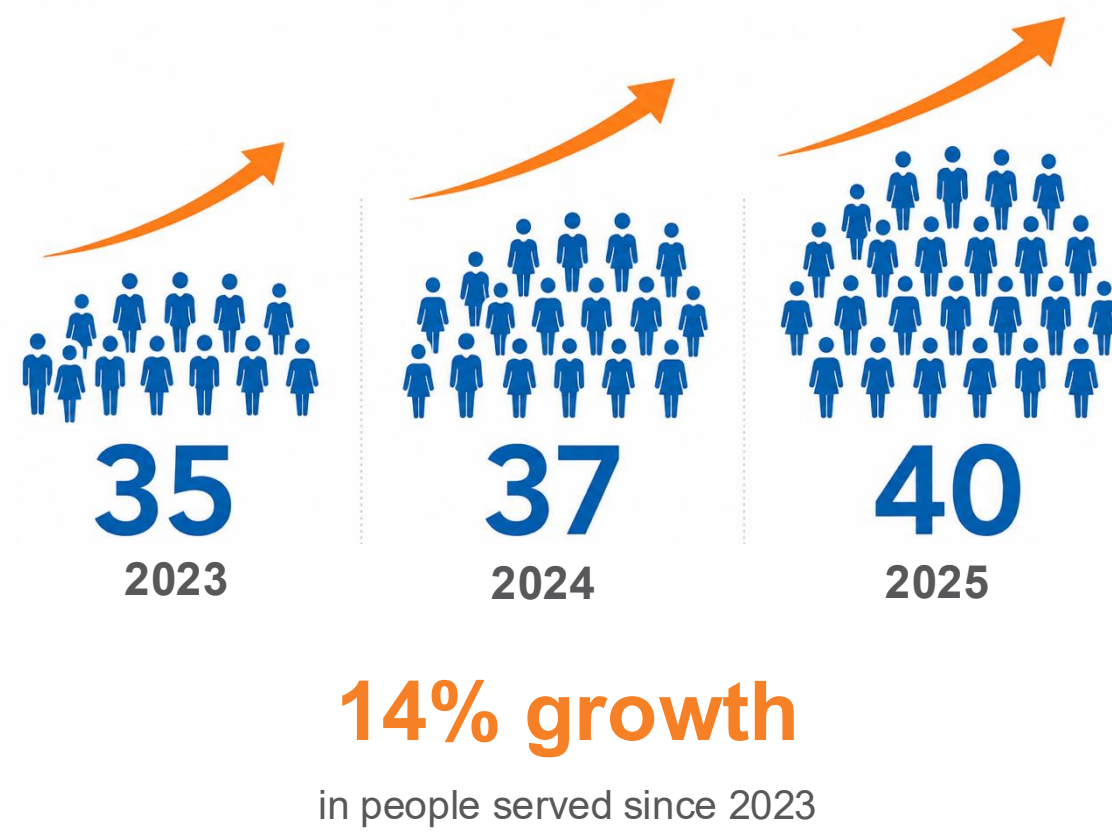

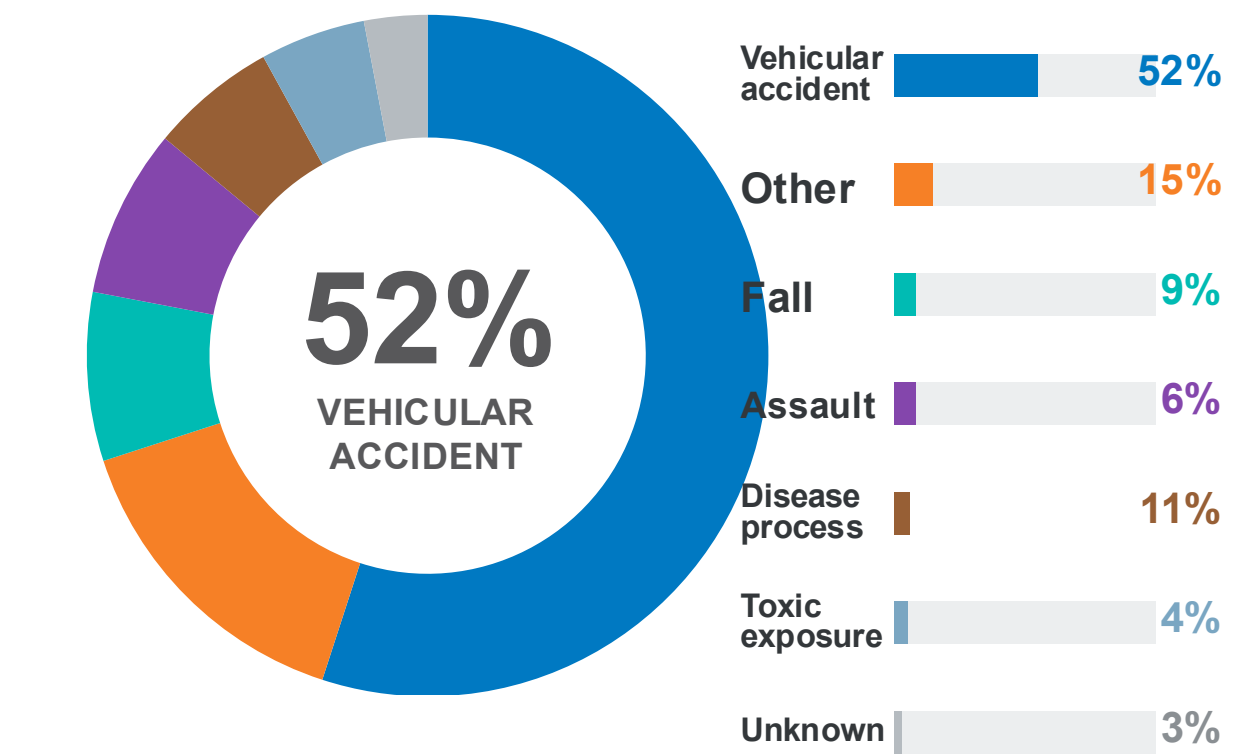


The 2025 population remained predominantly White and not Hispanic, with a modest increase in Black participants compared with 2024.

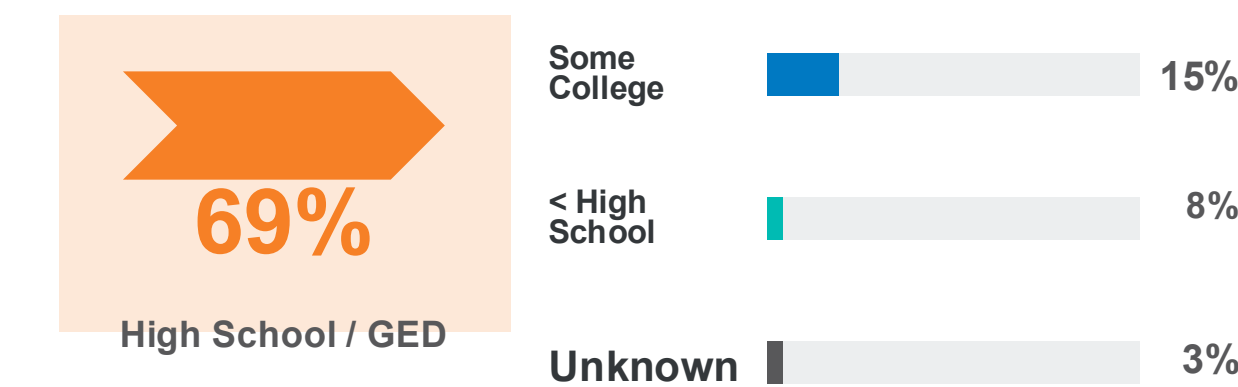
Three-Year Reach



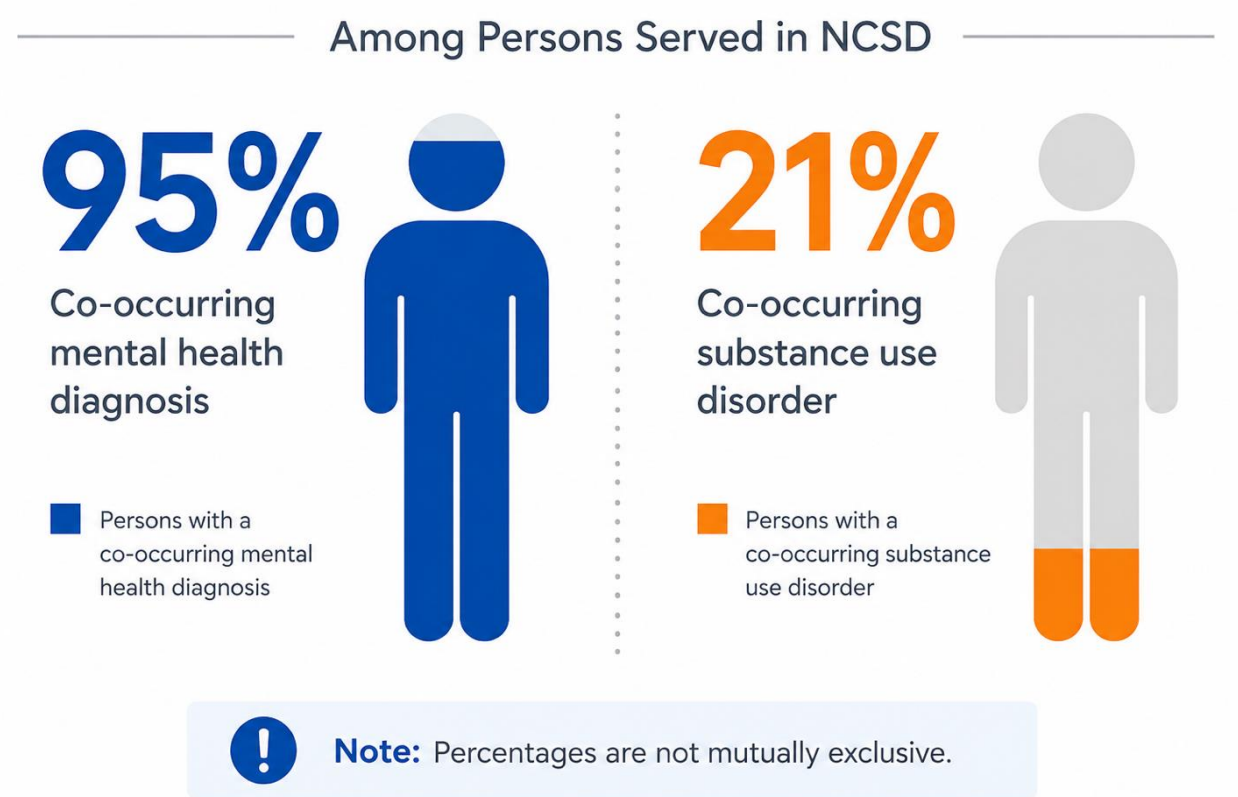
Cause of Injury



Educational Level



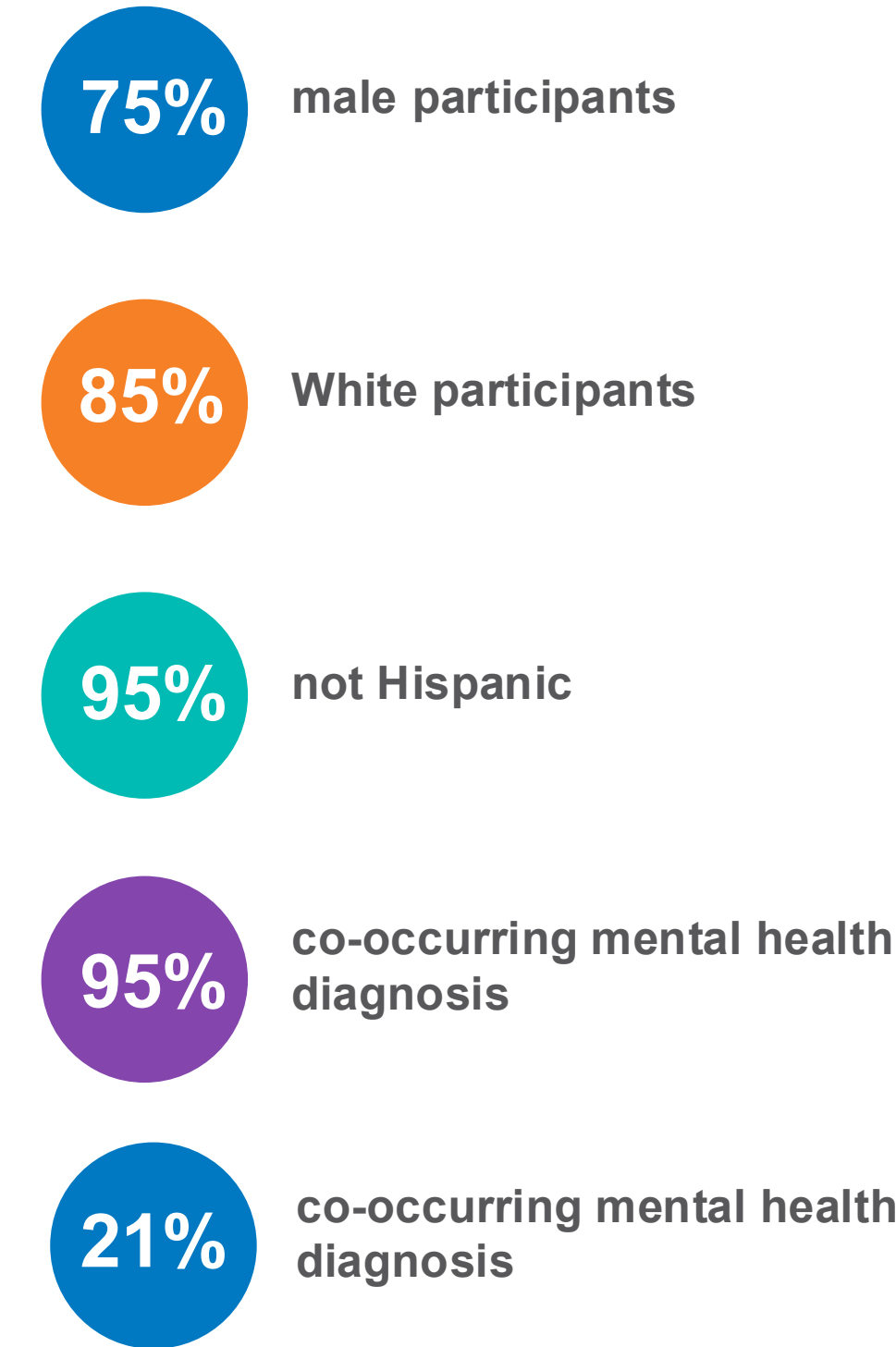

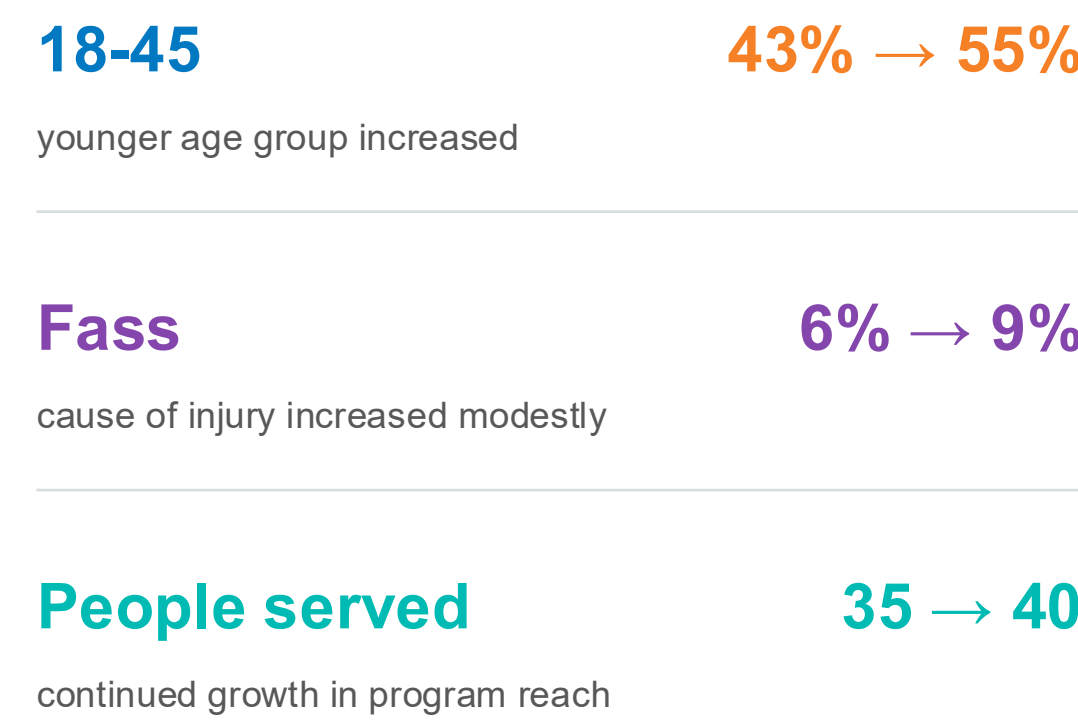

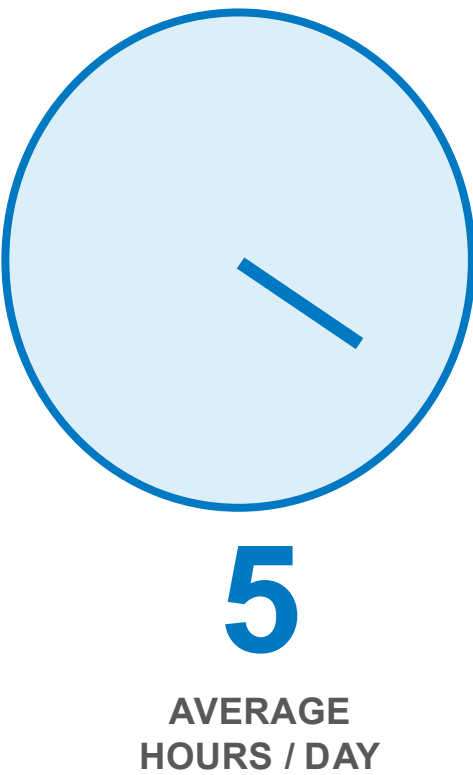


WHY IT MATTERS

Maintaining function can be a meaningful outcome for people with complex neurocognitive conditions—supporting safety, independence and quality of life.

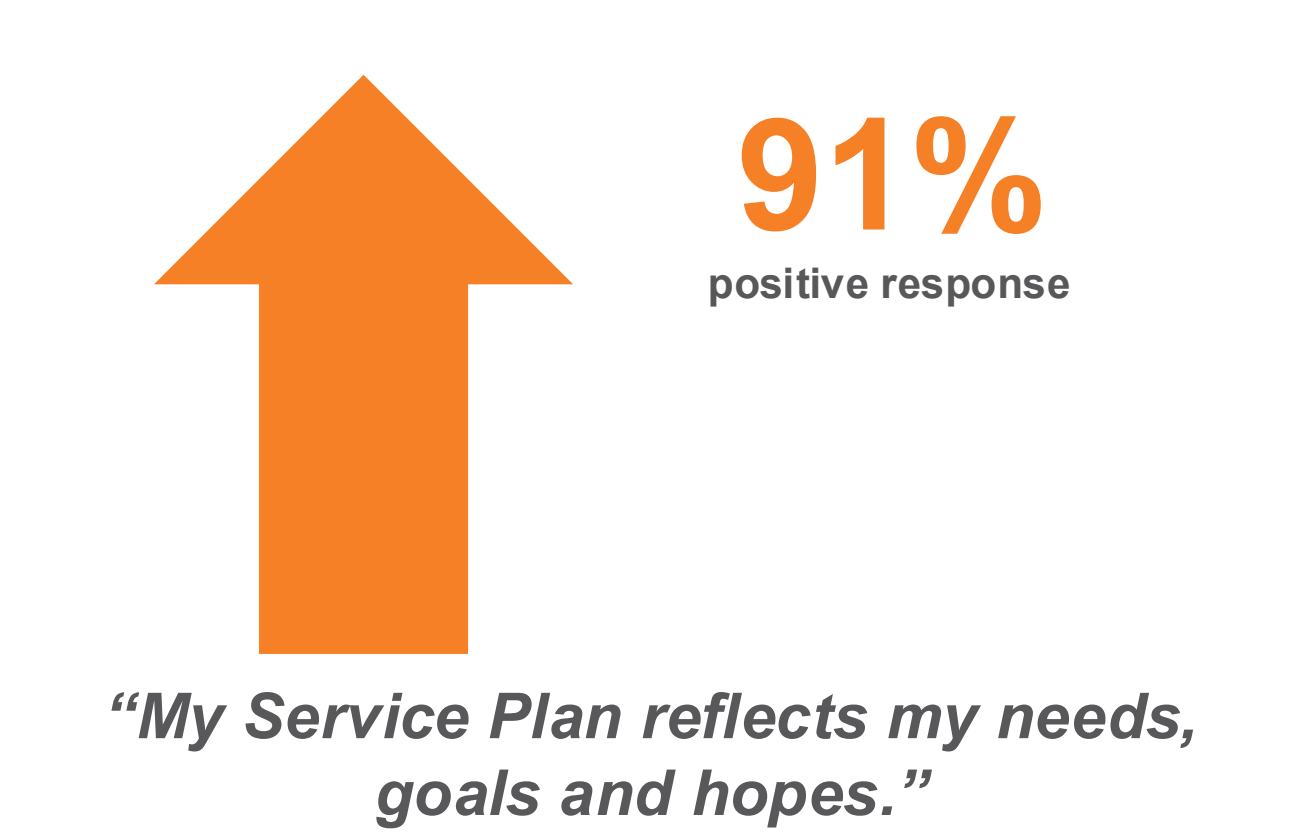
Average Treatment Hours

A Structured Day

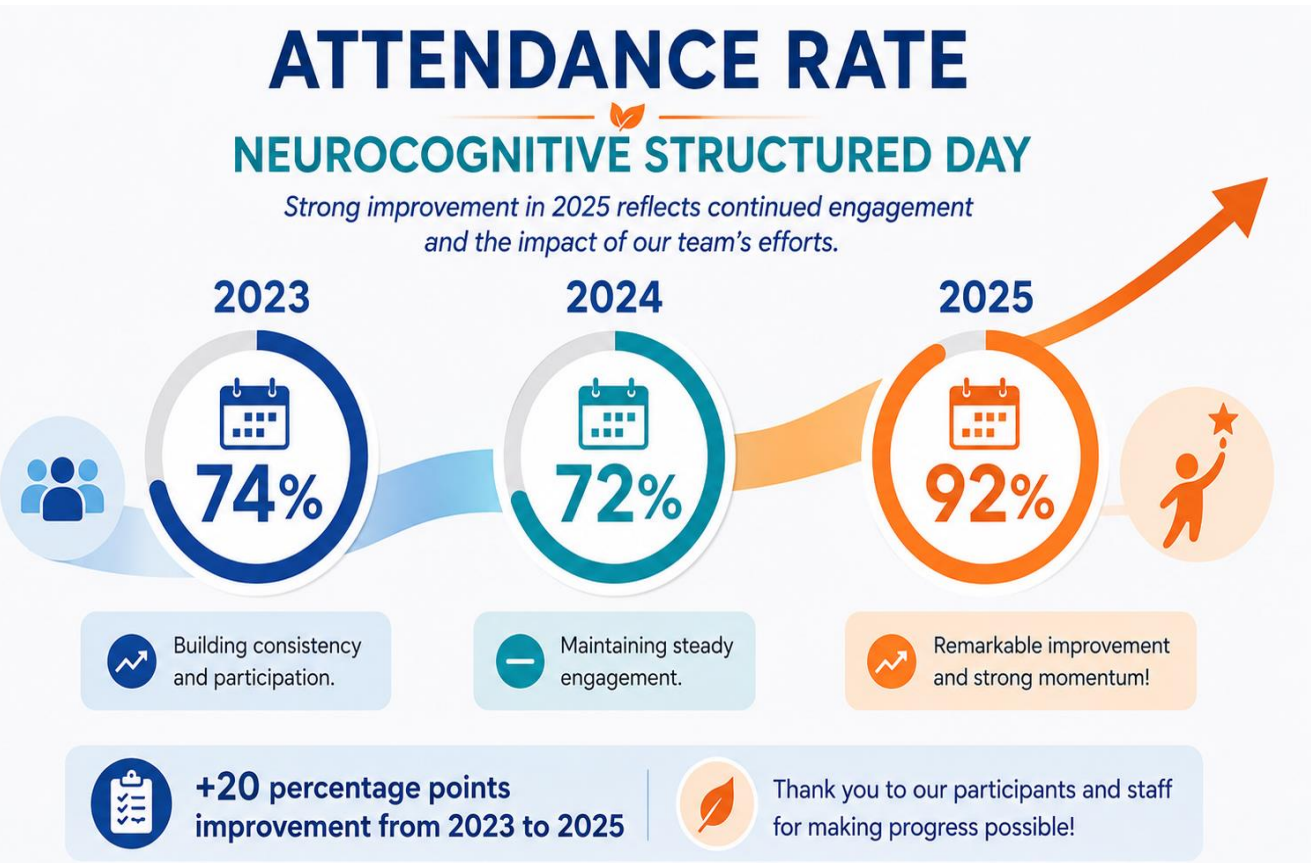


Participants take advantage of a schedule of activities designed to support their individualized cognitive, behavioral, functional and community-living goals.

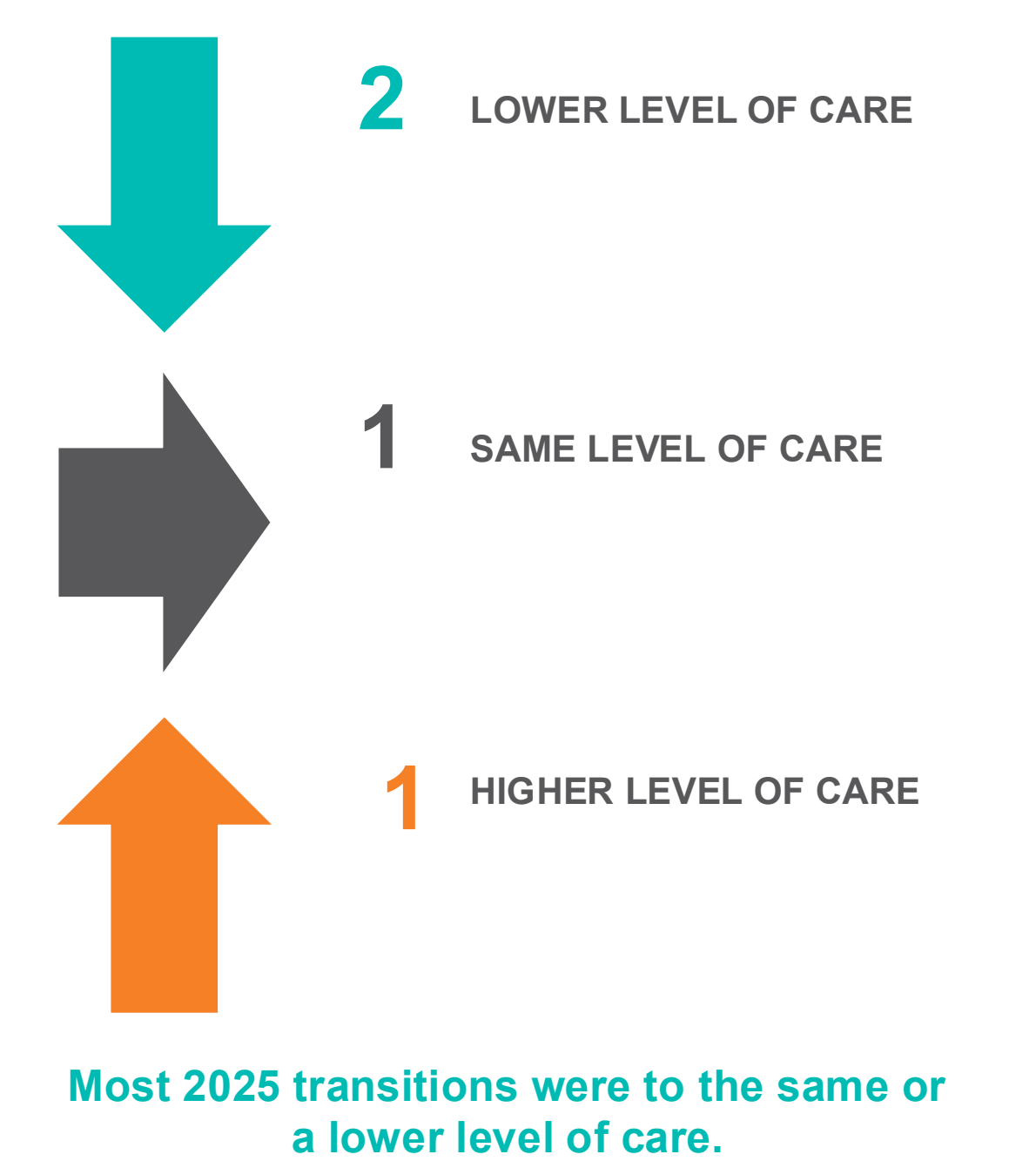


Progress is reflected not only in improvement, but also in sustained function, stronger engagement, and successful transitions.

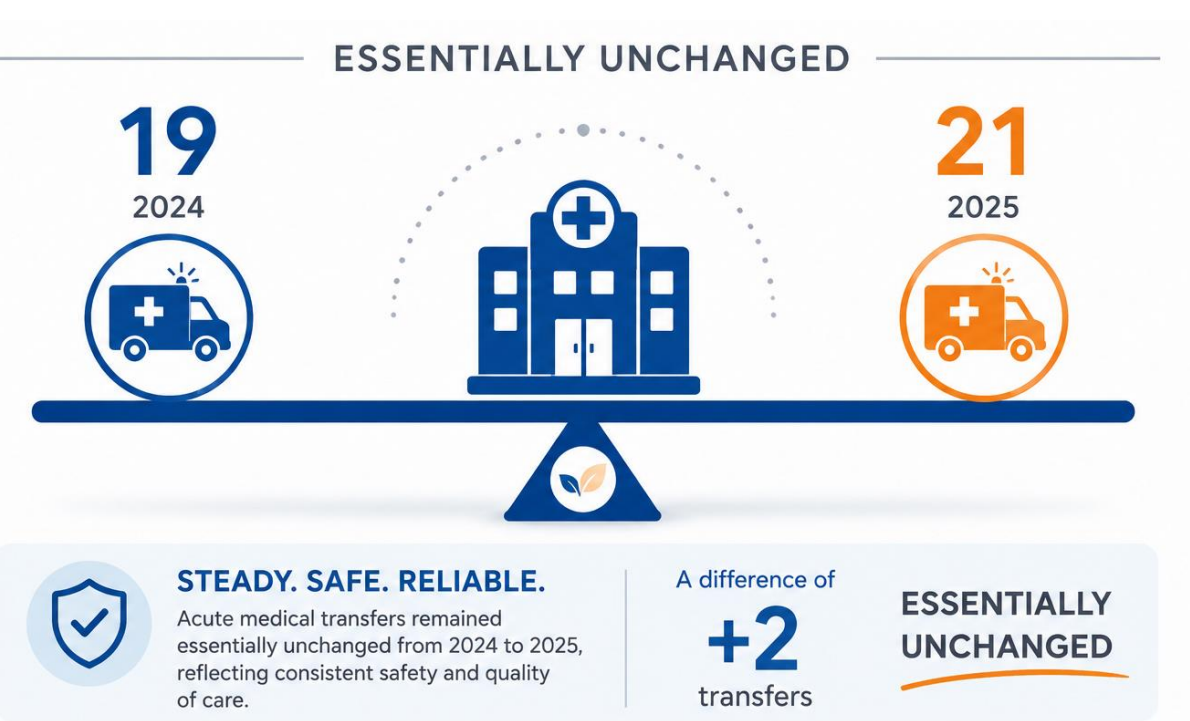
WHAT DOES THIS MEAN?

2025 results reflect strong engagement and sustained functional stability. Attendance increased to 92%, satisfaction remained high across stakeholder groups, and most transitions were to the same or a lower level of care. Acute medical transfers remained essentially unchanged.
