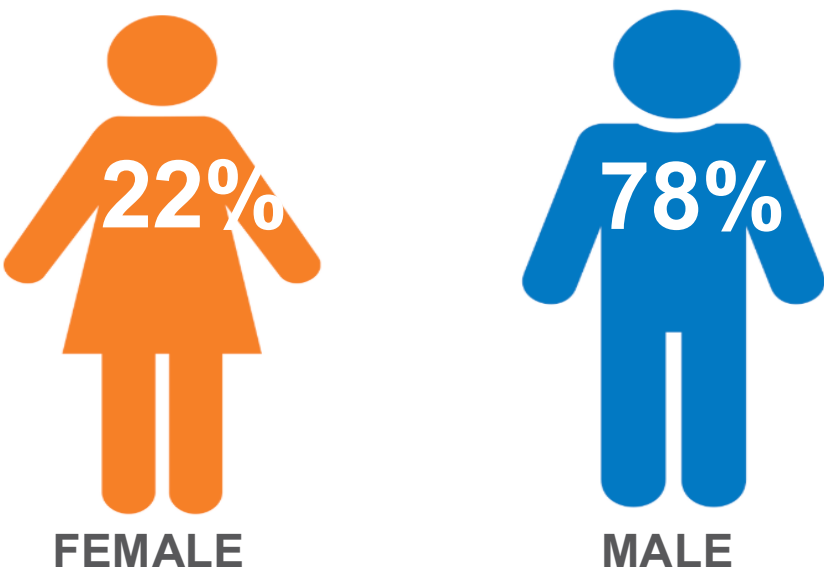

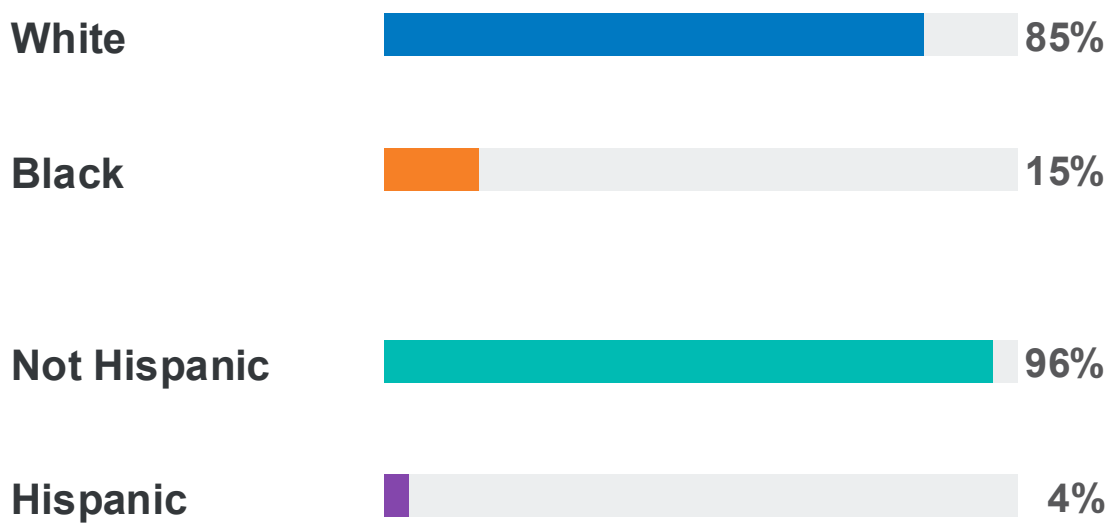
AGE DISTRIBUTION



GENDER

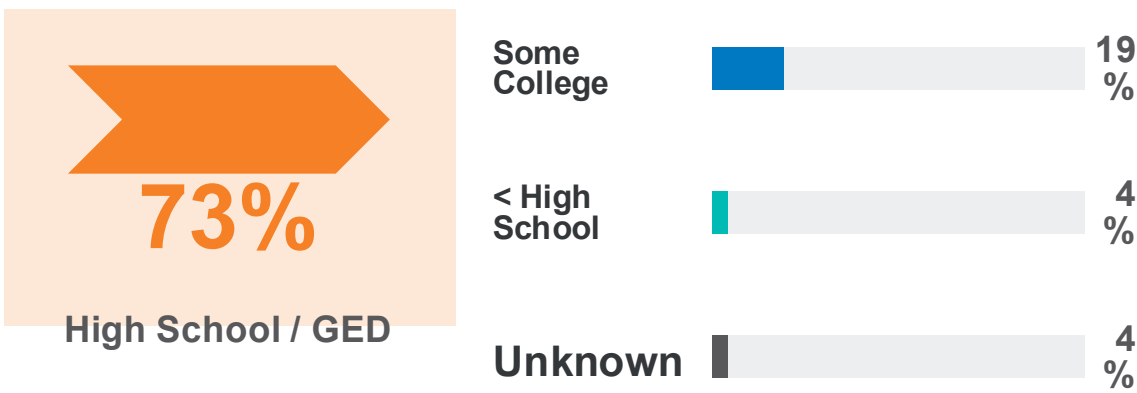


Race / Ethnicity

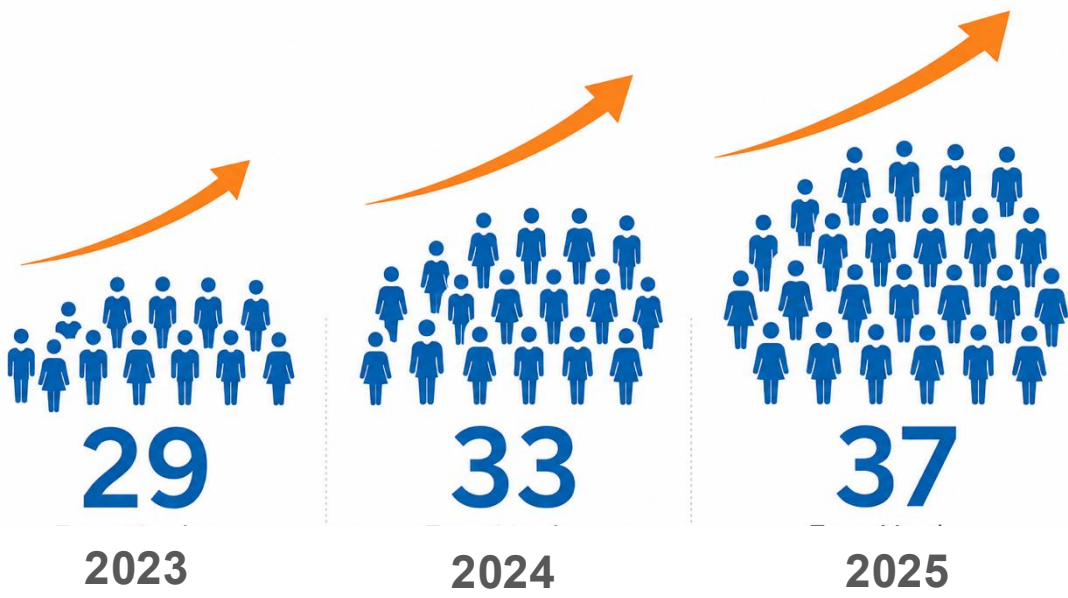


The 2025 population remained predominantly White and not Hispanic, with a modest increase in Black participants compared with 2024.

Educational Level

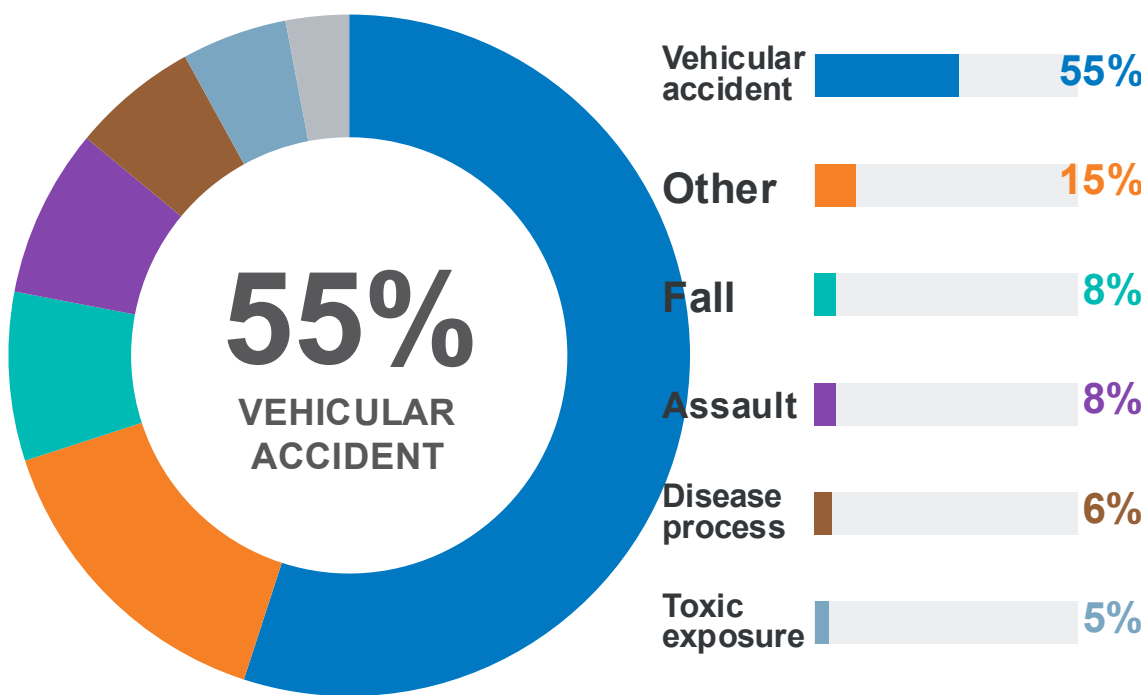


Three-Year Reach

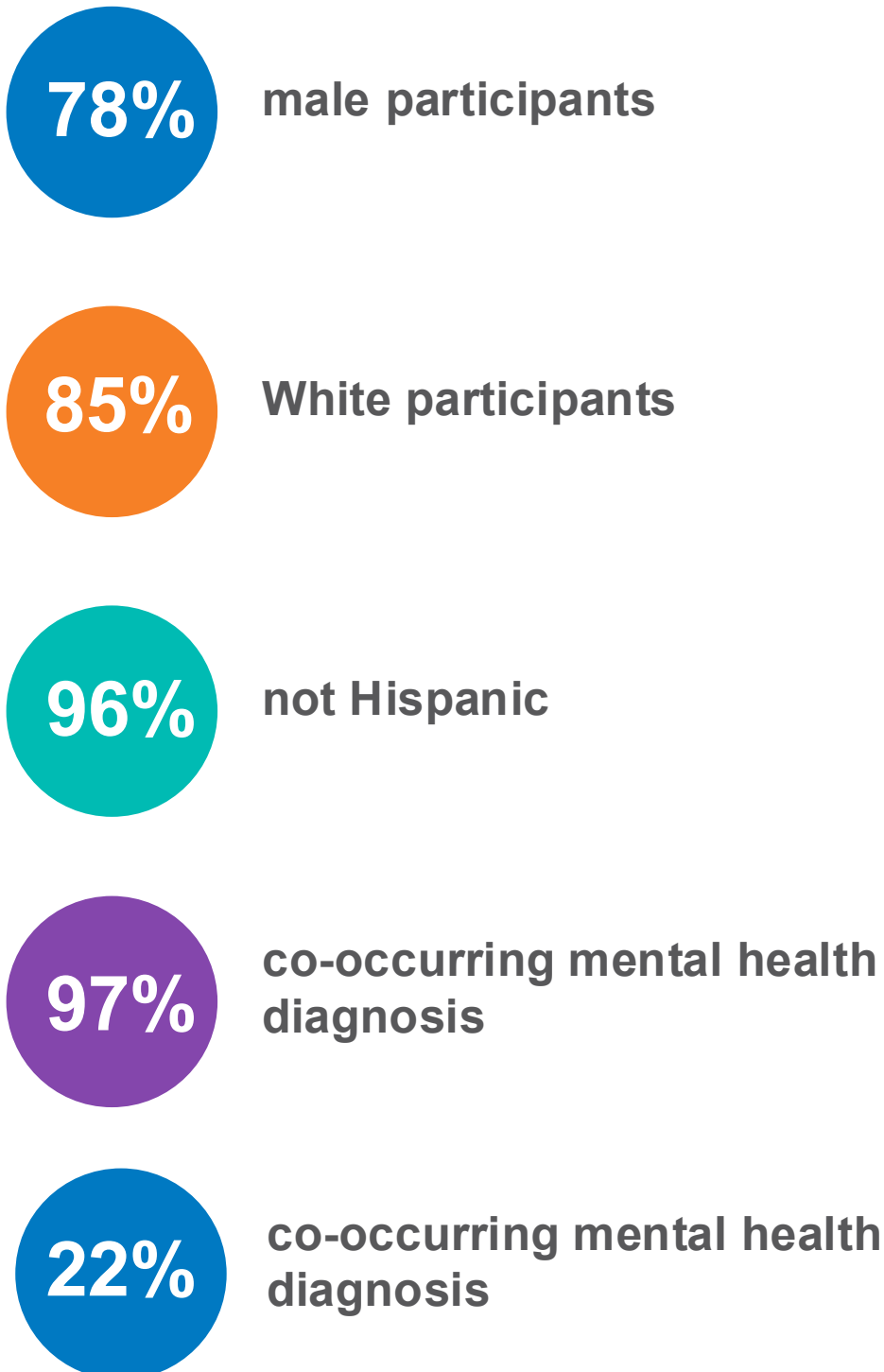

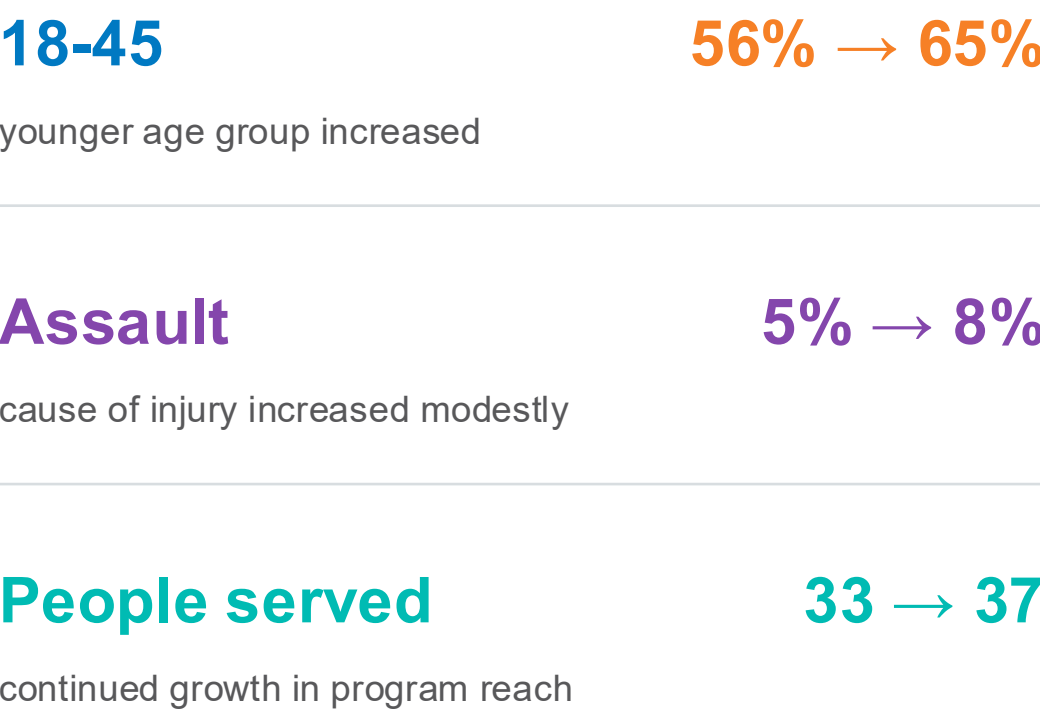
WHAT THIS MEANS

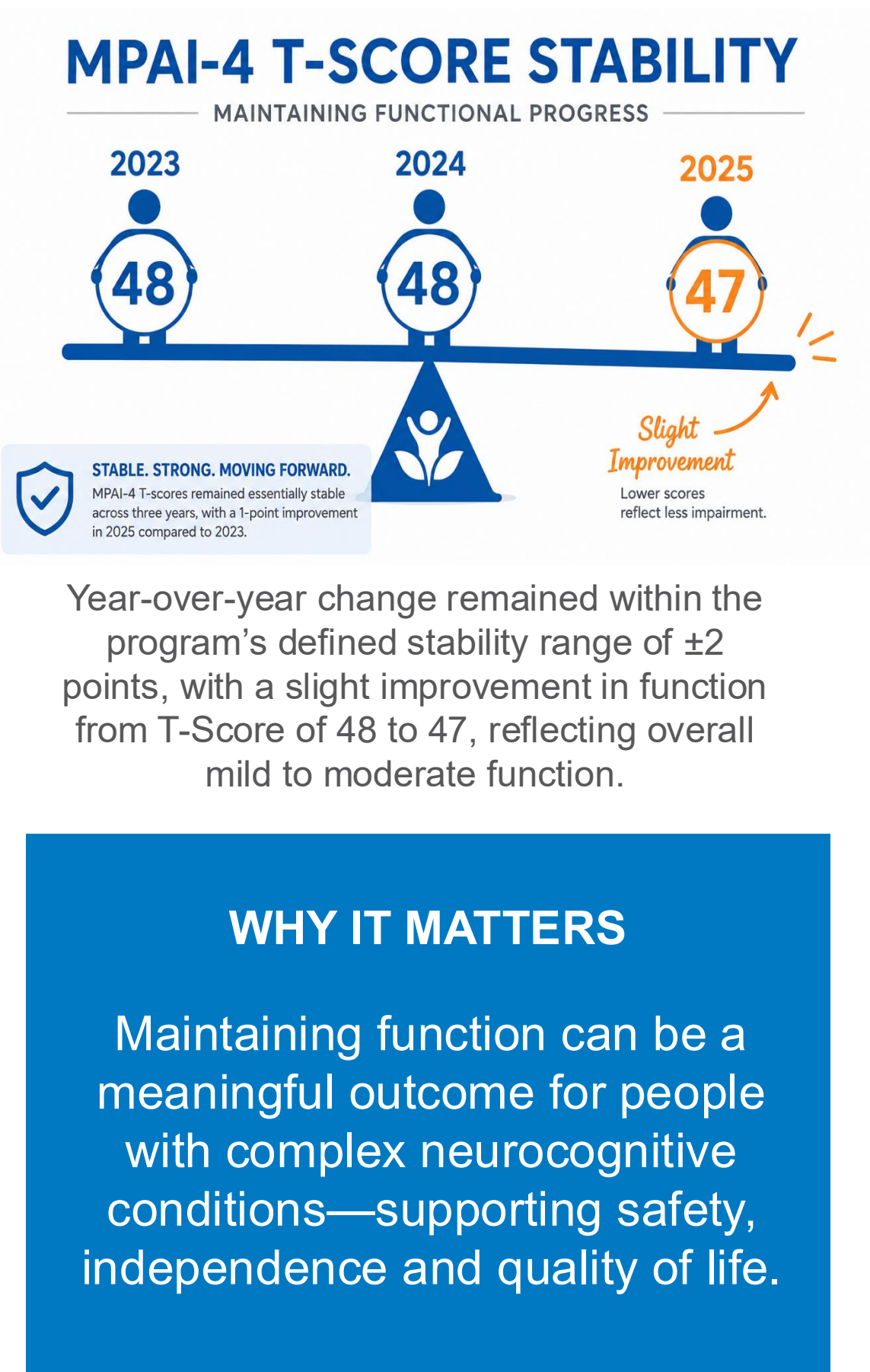

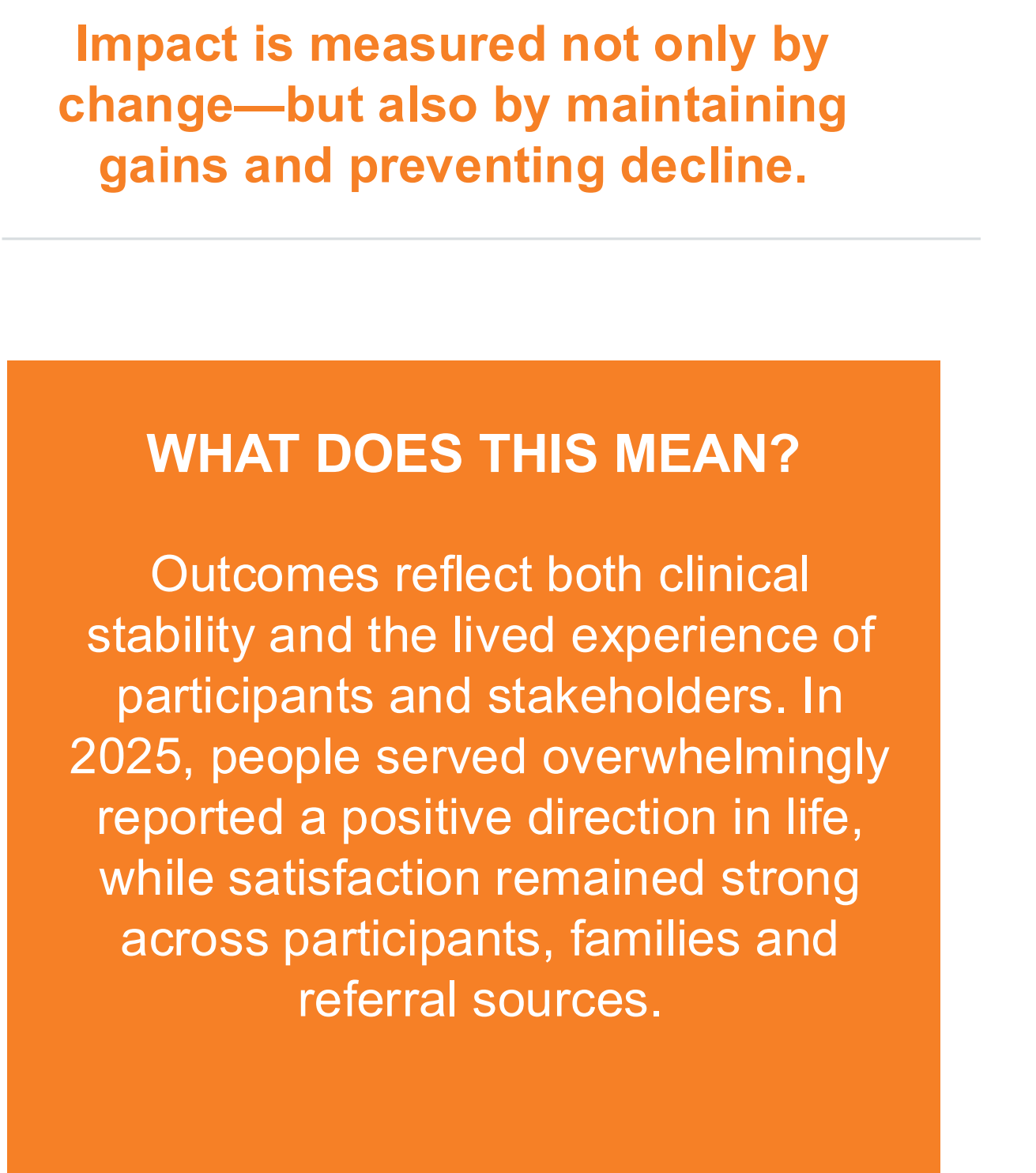

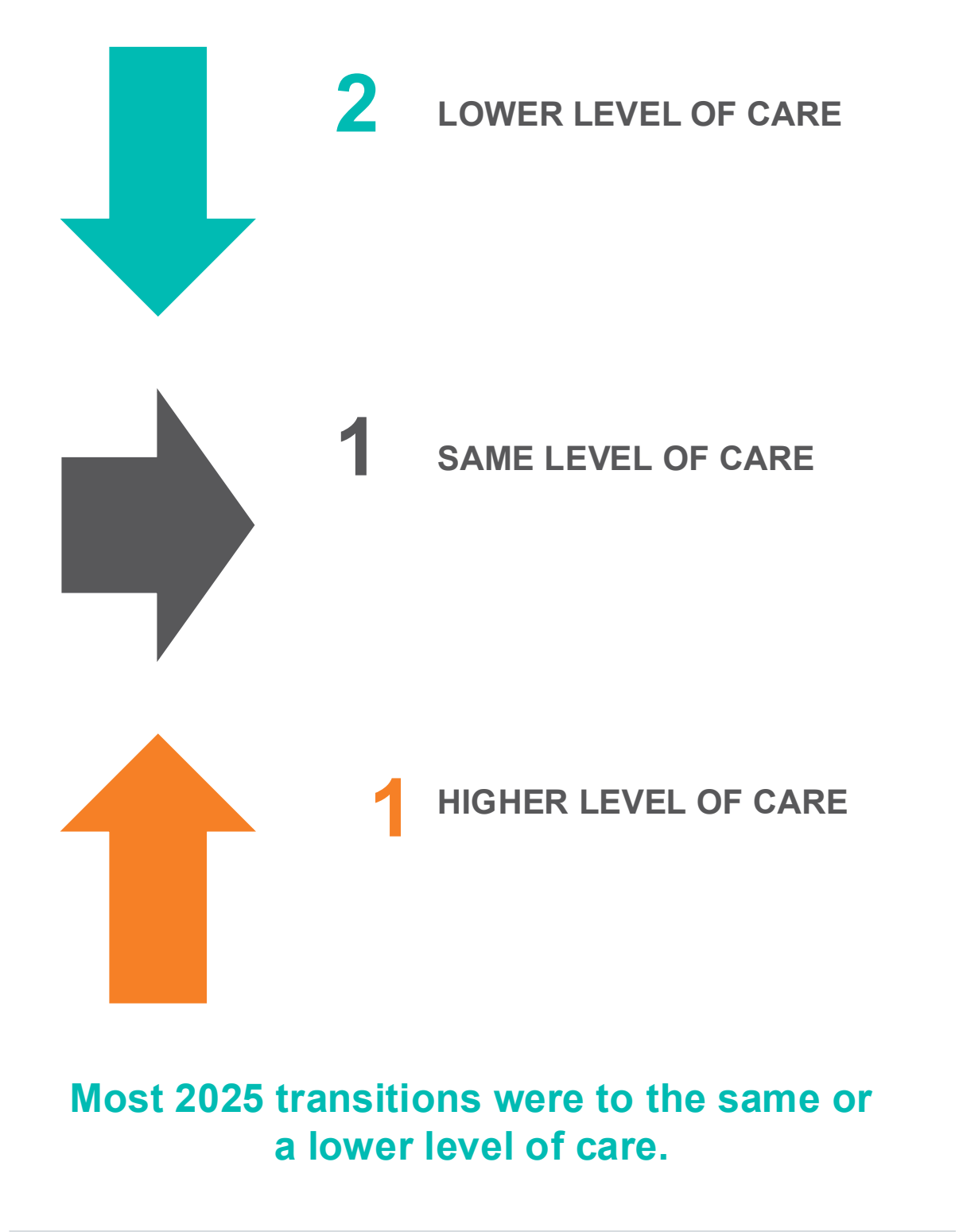
